

EMERGENCY CASE GUIDE FOR PETS

CRITICAL CASES

CONTACT AN EMERGENCY VET IF
YOUR PET IS EXPERIENCING ANY OF
THESE SYMPTOMS

- Open mouth & labored breathing
- Collapsing or unable to walk
- Vomiting blood
- Distended abdomen & bloating
- Broken/fractured limbs
- Possible ingestion of foreign material
- Exposure to poison
- Excessive bleeding

URGENT CASES

IF YOUR PET IS EXPERIENCING ONE
OF THESE SYMPTOMS, IT IS NOT AN
EMERGENCY, BUT THEY SHOULD SEE
A VET WITHIN 24 HOURS

- Diarrhea & Vomiting
for more than 24 hours
- Major cuts & wounds
- Broken toenail
- Not eating for more than 24 hours
- Major eye issue
(out of socket is critical)
- Urinary issue

MINOR CASES

IF YOUR PET IS EXPERIENCING ANY
OF THESE SYMPTOMS, WAIT TO
CONTACT YOUR REGULAR VET

- Ear, skin and anal glad issues
- Minor eye issue
- Coughing, sneezing,
upper respiratory issues
- Diarrhea only
- Limping
